4. a) Briefly discuss Ngugi's contribution to the emergence, growth and relevance of fiction in East Africa. (10 Mks)

b.) Using any of Ngugi's texts, discuss any five outstanding literary devices deployed in narration common to East African writers. (10 Mks)

5. Drawing illustrations from at least three short stories, examine how East African writers have exploited the genre's uniqueness to advance East African themes.
