- 5. Closely revisiting the views of any TWO scholars studied in this course, illustrate how postcolonial theory deconstructs colonial notions of identity and belonging. Use examples from a novel studied in this course (20 marks).
- 6. What are the key components of psychoanalysis as outlined by Sigmund Freud, Carl Jung and Jacques Lacan? (20 marks).
- 7. What is postmodernism and how useful is it in the study of literary texts? Illustrate with examples from a literary text studied in this course (20 marks).
