- 2. Jane is a 25 year old lady. She goes to the hospital because she is unwell. The symptoms she describes include fever, rash and flu- like symptoms. She reports that she might have been exposed recently but cannot recall when. The medical practitioner suspects HIV infection.
 - **a.** Which stage of infection could Jane be in? Explain. (**3Marks**)
 - b. Which laboratory test should be done to ascertain HIV infection? (2Marks)
- 3. T lymphocytes are thought to be vital immune cells in the body. Explain (5Marks)
- **4.** Describe giving clear examples how **some geographical regions** and **persons** are vulnerable to HIV infection. (**5Marks**)
- Students from Jeramogi Oginga Odinga University of Science and technology want to do a community outreach activity in peer education. How will this be undertaken? (4Marks)
- 6. 'Despite the numerous research that is underway, still a portent HIV vaccine has been elusive'. Briefly describe reasons for this statement.(4Marks)
- 7. Describe one theory that has been postulates to be the origin of HIV (2Marks)
