- b). Suggest **five** strong points you would advise households in drought prone counties to put in place as coping strategies for food shortages at the household levels.

Describe how you would go ahead teaching the community members how to adopt to the only supply of food by the FAO organization in the area. Be sure to include how you would deal with the potential challenges of such food distributions.
