OUESTION FOUR

An urban planner wanted to study how the tarmacking of given roads had influenced the development of commercial and residential properties over the last five years and the rates at

which they were being rented in two secondary towns in Kenya. In particular, the planner wanted to know the proportion of commercial and residential properties. Furthermore, he also wanted to establish the proportion of residential properties in terms of bungalows, mansions and apartments. The study was to cover developments within 150m buffer (on either sides of the roads) for 5km stretches of the road.
