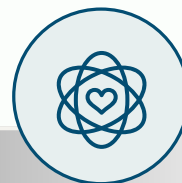

He thanked Prof. Agong' for having laid down the foundation upon which JOOUST stands on. Among notable achievements that have been realized under his tenure include; gross increase in student numbers, recruitment of staff to support student welfare, expanded tuition space and improved research capacity and



extension services. Of particular recognition is the operationalization of the World Bank supported African Centre of Excellence for Sustainable use of Insects as Food and Feeds (INSEFOODS), Global Pii Institute and successful bidding of two main grants towards, a) Strengthening of natural resources, food security and health with the support of VLIR; b) Provision of technical support for health service delivery in partnership with four counties supported by USAID among other milestones.

The in-coming acting Vice Chancellor Professor Joseph Bosire praised the out-going Vice-Chancellor, Professor Agong' for his servant leadership to the University. He promised that he will work with the entire university fraternity to ensure that the University lives up to its vision of becoming a global leader in university education and research

Professor Stephen Agong' term comes to an end after having served as the founding Principal of the then Bondo University College and later Vice -Chancellor when he led the 2013.

COUNCIL APPOINTS NEW DEPUTY VICE CHANCELLOR, PLANNING ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE



The University Council has appointed Prof. Aggrery Thuo as the Deputy Vice-Chancellor Planning, Administration and Finance.

Prof. Thuo holds a Ph.D. in Environmental Planning from The University of Waikato, New Zealand; Master of Environmental Planning and Management (Kenyatta University); an Executive MBA from Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology; MSc in Urban Planning from Sangai International University; and Bachelor of Environmental Studies (Planning and Management) from Kenyatta University. He has also undergone a number of professional trainings in Kenya and abroad



He has over 20 years of work experience at the University levels. Prior to joining JOOUST, he served as an Associate Professor at the Department of Spatial and Environmental Planning, Kenyatta University. He had also served Maasai Mara University as an Associate Professor in Urban and Regional Programme. In addition, he was a Senior Lecturer at Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology, Department of Land Resources Planning and Management. Beginning his academic career, he taught as a Lecturer and Assistant Lecturer at the Department of Environmental Planning and Management, Kenyatta. Between January 2017 to December 2018- he served Honorary Professor, Western University, London, Canada.

At Maasai Mara University he was appointed by the University Council as acting Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Administration, Finance and Planning) and have also on various times served as acting Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic, Research and Student Affairs). He also served in Maasai Mara University as a Dean for more than five years.

At the Universities where he has worked, he have had served as a member in various University committees, Chairperson of various University committees.

Other than University experience, he has also served as a Chairman, County Land Management Board, an appointment by the National Land Commission.



Prof. Thuo is a Corporate Member of Kenya Institute of Planners. He is also a Licensed National Environment Management Authority (Kenya) Lead Expert/ Auditor.

JOOUST COMMENCES CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMME WITH FLEMISH UNIVERSITIES



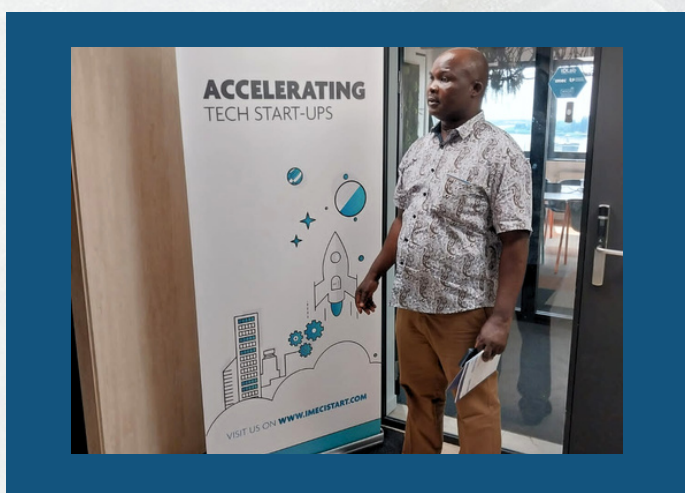
Jaramogi Oginga Odinga University of Science and Technology (JOOUST) entered into a global strategic partnership with five Flemish Universities to train JOOUST staff on natural resource management, agri-food systems, health systems, ICT, and climate change. The five Flemish universities that the university is partnering with include Vrije Universiteit Brussel, KU Leuven, Ghent University, University of Antwerp, and Hasselt University.

A total of twelve staff members have already been onboarded into the training program on a scholarship basis as Ph.D. students and are expected to commence coursework at the respective Flemish Universities within the year 2023



Already, three members of staff namely Mr. Kevin Onyango, Ms. Dorothy Gwada and Ms. Lilian Wanyonyi are currently in Belgium to commence their coursework. Other staff who have already travelled to Belgium include Prof. Benson Estambale, Mr. Naphtaly Osika, Prof. Silvanca Abeka, Dr. Caleb Olweny and Dr. Jane Owenga

At the end of the ten year period, it is expected that a number of i) programmes shall have been accredited while others reviewed, ii) laboratory equipment procured, iii) ICT network improved, iv) strategic partnerships and networks created, v) publications in peer reviewed journals, vi) at least thirty PhD students graduated.



JOOUSTES HOLDS A STAKEHOLDER VALIDATION MEETING



Jaramogi Oginga Odinga University of Science and Technology holds a stakeholder meeting on the Institutional commercialization masterplan. The process is being spearheaded by the Directorate of Enterprise Services (JOOUSTES).

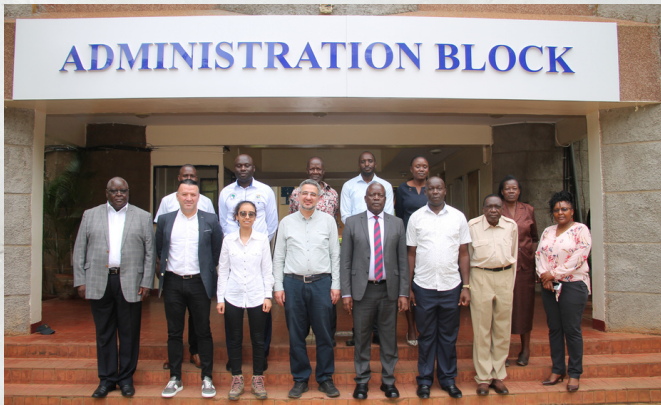

The main functions of the enterprise include reviewing the IGU policy of the University from time to time, categorize income-generating opportunities for ease of administration among more.

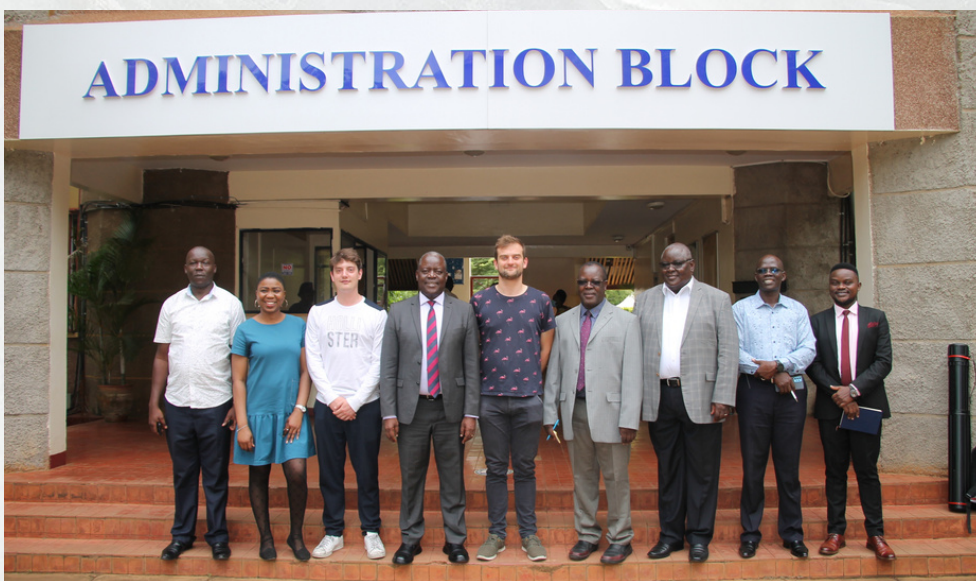




The University received a team from the International Undergraduate Research Symposium (IURS). The Symposium sought to inspire and prepare each student for successful scientific life of service to humanity.
